In this role, he spearheads IAD's strategic initiatives and partnerships to ensure the Illinois Deaf and Hard of Hearing community's collective interests are represented among Illinois' policy makers. Corey is a recent past-chair of the National Association of the Deaf (NAD) Outreach Committee, having been appointed by the NAD Board of Directors. In recognition of his contributions to local and national civic advocacy the NAD awarded Corey with the Knights of Flying Fingers Award in 2016.
